Cassa Integrazione¹, Dismissals and Unemployment

The INPS communicated that during the first two months of 2012 the "tiraggio" (percentage of total authorized hours actually utilized) wad by 36.4%.

During the first five months of 2012 the authorized hours of Cassa Integrazione Guadagni were in line with the same period of 2011, both in Italy and in the Milan Area.

In the Milan Area the authorized CIG increased by 62% in May 2012 as compared with April 2012: the growth occurred for every single element of CIG. Instead, the increase compared with May 2011 was weaker (8%).

In May also the CIGO of the **Assolombarda companies** augmented in all sectors, except for chemical-rubber-plastics.

In Italy the growth of Unemployment didn't stop: in April 2012 the rate of unemployment went up to 10.2% from 10.1% in March. However the Italian value remained below the European average, which was static at 11%. In the Euro Area the unemployment rate increased in Spain and in France, while it decreased in Germany again. The Unemployment was descending from September 2011 in the USA.

Cassa Integrazione Guadagni (CIG) is a specific Italian shock absorber. It is a redundancy fund which helps companies to maintain the labour force in times of economic difficulties. It allows workers to receive a part of their wages. There are three kinds of CIG: Ordinary (Cassa Integrazione Ordinaria – CIGO), Extraordinary (Cassa Integrazione Straordinaria – CIGS) and Special (Cassa Integrazione in Deroga – CIG in Deroga).
