

Introduction Creative Mediterranean

Nablus Furniture Cluster was created under the banner of Creative Mediterranean, an extensive cooperation project funded by UE and Italy involving seven countries, from the Atlantic to the Middle East: Algeria, Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon, Morocco, Palestine and Tunisia.

Creative Mediterranean supports the development of clusters in cultural and creative industries in the participating countries, that is to say geographic and strategic concentrations of interconnected companies, institutions and suppliers working in the same field of activity, considered as a mean to promote the development of competitive industries and facilitate local economic development. The goal of the project is to strengthen craftsmen and SMEs' creativity and competitiveness, as well as management, business strategies and access to markets of groups of companies.

Through the project, each country is taken into account in its specificity, through the opportunity to make known the result of a wide range of creative and productive realities in the area and in the international market from Europe to the Gulf countries. Thus, Creative Mediterranean emphasizes the presence, behind every single craftsman or artist, of complex realities of families and communities, of handed down stories and ties. In this framework, local actors play an active role in preserving ancient knowledge and elaborate it for the globalized modernity; they adapt ancestral expertise to modern practices. Therefore, they improve their economic activity as well as employment opportunities and overall situation in the region, making from their creativity a tool of resilience.

Nablus Furniture Cluster

Founded in 2015 by the Nablus Chamber of Commerce and Industry, the Nablus Furniture Cluster (NFC) gathers over 25 companies - with more than 200 full time employees - that are located in the industrial hub of Nablus, Palestine. Specialized in upholstery and wooden furniture, the NFC's members design and manufacture a wide assortment of products for the retail and the contract sector, apply high quality standards and respond to the customization demands of professionals and business partners.

The city of Nablus boasts a long tradition in furniture production. Thanks to its strategic geographical position and to the highly skilled craftsmanship that has always distinguished its workshops along the centuries, Nablus has historically been a productive centre at the crossroads of commercial exchanges in the region and the Middle East at large.

Today, the Nablus Furniture Cluster supports the development of new furniture collections, thanks to training programs and investments in new equipment, and work for local markets as well as foreign markets exporting to Israel, Europe and the Middle East.

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
Nablus,

the little Damascus at the crossroads of the Middle East

An ancient urban district whose origins date back to the dawn of history, the area of Nablus has been steadily inhabited for over two millenniums. Founded as the city of Flavia Neapolis by the Romans, Nablus still preserves precious heritages of the empires that have ruled it across the centuries. Today, its city centre is still a jewel of Ottoman architecture, which beautiful buildings represent one of the best-preserved housing compounds of Palestine and the Middle East.

The beauty of its palaces has always gone along with the refinement of its manufacturing activities, from furniture to handicrafts, produced for the rich merchants that had elected Nablus as their hub for commerce. In the medina, its cafes have not only been popular meeting places, but have also put the bases for the development of the archetype of "diwan" and coffee tables as the heart of the Arab home.

Today, the oldest furniture cluster in Palestine has evolved into the place where modern production facilities meet highly skilled workforce to produce a wide assortment of furniture for the domestic and foreign market. From traditional Arabic, to modern and contemporary classic, Nablus's heritage is transmitted to furniture design and production in a multitude of styles and in versatile and multiple solutions.
