Italian manufacturing in global rankings

Italy ranks #6 economy in the world for manufacturing trade surplus ...

... and #7 for share of global manufacturing value added

Lombardy is the #1 manufacturing region in Italy and the #2 in Europe

Manufacturing gross value added at basic prices by region** (top 10), billion euro - 2020



Lombardy is diversified by firm size...



94% of firms are micro (0-9 employees) accounting for 40% of the total workforce

almost medium enterprises 1,100 30% of the total 3,700 in Italy

innovative startups 3.700 more than 1/4 of the total 13,800 in Italy

firms with turnover > €1 bn 136 in Milan (vs 83 Munich, 30 Barcelona)
